On April 12 an exceptional 8.01 ct ruby, accompanied with a Report and an Appendix from the Gübelin Gem Lab confirming the Burmese origin and unheated state of the stone, achieved a new record per carat price of US\$ 274,656 yielding a total hammer price of US\$ 2.2 million. As unheated rubies of this quality are increasingly rare, this record price reflects the undersupply of such exceptional stones.

*** GGL conducts Off-Premise Testing in Sri Lanka in May

The Colombo Show, a new international gem and jewellery trade fair organised by Ceylinco Gem Corp, will be held from May 9 to 11 at the New Convention and Exhibition Centre of the Bandaranayake Memorial International Convention Hall in Colombo.  The city of Dubai, United Arab Emirates, has seen significant investments to position itself as the centre of
 the Middle East for the gold, diamond, and gemstone industry. In the last couple of months, a dedicated
 tax-free zone has been established, including huge properties to host manufacturing, trading and retail
 businesses. The GGL has been invited to visit these facilities, and held a lecture on origin determination in
 coloured gemstones, complementing the recently installed shuttle service between Dubai and Lucerne.

Dr. Eduard J. Gübelin, who sadly passed away last month, has devoted his entire life to the research of gemstones.
